## QUICKTIPS



for a Gospel-Sharing Youth Ministry

- 1. **Be Strategic.** A youth ministry full of students that share the gospel is not something that happens by accident; it is an intentional discipleship process. That means you have to be strategic in planning your youth ministry for maximum Gospel-sharing impact. Action Steps:
  - Plan a sermon/message series leading into the beginning of the school year that emphasizes students sharing the Gospel and making a difference in their generation at school and beyond. You can find sermon series at <u>youthalive.com</u>.
  - Attend a Youth Alive event, or plan your own training day to equip students to share the Gospel using *Alive in 5* and start Youth Alive Movements (clubs, prayer movements, huddles, etc.)
  - Promote and help students plan for See You At The Pole.
- 2. Help students see their school as a mission field; and they are the missionaries. All who follow Jesus are called to share Jesus. Students are sent to their campus, their culture, to share the Gospel just as Jesus sent His disciples (John 20:21-22). Action Steps:
  - Five Friend Focus—students should create a prayer list of at least five friends they want to share the Gospel with. Download from <u>youthalive.com</u>.
  - Refer to the Five Friend Focus regularly, have students pray for their Five Friend Focus in youth group, at home. Check in with them regularly.
- 3. **Equip students to share the Gospel—use** *Alive in 5* in your youth ministry. Make it the language you use to communicate the Gospel simply and effectively. This will help students memorize it. Action Steps:
  - Use the Alive in 5 Booklet and train them have Gospel conversations. (available at myhealthychurch.com)
  - Challenge students students to share the Gospel using the Alive in 5 booklet once a month
    during the school year. If they do this, they will have shared the Gospel with a friend nine times
    before the end of the school year.
  - Have enough Alive in 5 booklets on hand to resupply students as needed.
- 4. **Help students start a Youth Alive Movement at school**—Youth Alive Clubs, prayer movements, Huddles, etc. Help students work together at school to create a platform or opportunities to share the Gospel at school and beyond. Action steps:
  - Pray for every school; assess opportunities. Is there a club? If not, can we start one? If so, what other ways can our students work together to share the Gospel?
  - Use Youth Alive Movements packet to coach students in starting a Movement. Download from youthalive.com to help students discover their vision and then begin to start a Movement.
  - Work through the packets of each Movement students feel called to start.
  - · Help them develop their plan and set it into motion. Support, coach, and visit the Movement.
